## **Notes for Podcast One**

# Early recording at Bretton Hall 1963 - 1966

Throughout this series of podcasts we have referred to Mike as Mike Levon, but his original name, which he used until 1970 was Mike O'Connor, so that was the name on all the early Bretton recordings.

Before he came to Bretton, in his home town of Grantham, he was playing drums in a band with two others called 'The Trends' who played Shadows covers. He already had a tape machine and was interested in recording.

When he came to Bretton he was on 'Ents' which organised bands to play at Kennel Block, the students' bar. He played drums occasionally with other students in a band called Throb which included Clive Colling and Brian Wilson who played on various Holyground tracks.

Apart from the 12 inch album 'Last Thing on my Mind' we have also mentioned two 7 inch EPs, (extended play) 'Crossection' and 'Where its At' in the podcast, but in fact there was a third EP 'The Motley Crew', consisting solely of folk songs and shanties recorded in Kennel Block in 1966.

In Podcast One, we incorrectly identified Jenny Tarren's 'Lowlands' as being on 'Last Thing on My Mind', but it was in fact on 'Where Its At', the earlier EP.

'Last Thing on My Mind' had a Xeroxed booklet to accompany it, so there were fewer details on the cover. The tracks are rather randomly mixed with traditional folk songs alongside the first collaborations between Mike and Bob Hart.

Since this podcast episode was made, a discovery in the archive of another vinyl LP, 'Bar One', has been made - completely lost in Shirley's memory! The tracks are all folk, including some early Bob Dylan. Like some other Bretton records the sleeve is plain, but type-written details were Xeroxed and stuck on to the white covers that came with the pressings. Sleeves for other records were screen-printed in the college art rooms.

#### "THE MOTLEY CREW"

A LONG TIME AGO- A Capstan Shanty, roared out by the crew as they put their weight behind the capstan bars to heave the ancher aboard.
HAUL AWAY, JOE2 Used both as a 'Short Haul'and A 'Bowline' Shanty, i.e. various jobs on board requiring heavy, but short, starp pulls (N.B"Joe2 gh").
PADDY DOYLE'S BOOTS. The only, known'Bunt Shanty; sung by the arew up aloft as they did the dangerous work of furling and roping the sails (by buntlines) to the yardarms.
HEAVE AWAY, ME JOHNNY- A Halyard Shanty, used to help the long heaves as the upper sails were hoisted by means of long ropes or wires, known as hallards.

### SIDE TWO.

THE FILEN VANNIN TRAGEDY- This steamship of the Isle of Man Steam Packet Company sank in Liverpool Bayin 1899. The captain seems to have been a little over-zealous in his interpretation of the rule The mail must go through!

PADDY AND THE WHALE? An Irishman's version of a bible story?

THE HOLY GROUND- Said to have been the sailors, somewhat wry, nickname for an area of ill-repute(!) in Cobh, the deep water harhour for Cork, well-used by the old sailing ships.





# Crosssection, 1965






Screen-printed front cover of 'Crossection', and Xeroxed back cover




Screen-printed back cover for 'Where It's At'
